Member Spotlight

From the Garden, To Our Kitchen, To Your Table! At The Garden Bistro, garden-fresh is more than a concept.

Located at 119 North Main Street in downtown Eureka Springs in the Arts District, you will find just what the name of the restaurant implies; an intimate bistro-style café serving dishes created using vine-ripened, “just picked” fruits, vegetables, herbs and locally produced eggs and meats. During the season you can dine indoors or out on the patio. A recently remodeled ante-room is available for private parties or large groups.

Lunches are served Tea Room style from 11 am to 2 pm. In addition to daily specials, delicious quiches, soups, salads, pasta and sandwiches on fresh baked bread are served.

Casual fine dining is the atmosphere from 5 pm – 9pm. Entrees include steaks, seafood, chicken and pasta. All dinners are served with all-you-can-eat vegetable dishes of the day (when in season.) Adult beverages are available.

“Because our produce is garden-fresh, it gives our meals an amazingly wonderful texture and flavor. There is so much more enjoyment in fresh-picked green beans over canned,” explains co-owner and Chef Lana Campbell.

Serving meals made with fresh produce also results in diners finding many different menu items throughout the season. They’ve become famous for listening to their patrons’ suggestions, creating vegan soups and dishes that are gluten free.

“What diners find on our menu in May will definitely be different from what they find on our August and September menus,” says co-owner Robert Herrera. “We use local growers, so we vary the menu, sometimes daily.”

Chef Lana says that cooking local and fresh has its challenges.

According to Lana, “You can’t exactly set your full menu weeks ahead. Our menu responds to what is fresh and available at



the farmers’ markets in the area. Cooking with fresh produce is also very different than cooking with prepared foods. The tastes play off each other in different ways, so we’re creating new dishes and combinations all the time. There is little chance for ‘menu fatigue’, here. We have a few more challenges in the winter season with a completely ‘garden fresh’ menu, but thanks to our local farmers we are still getting great fresh produce. Come check out our hot house tomatoes and cucumbers.”

That’s not to say that since we opened last year that our regulars don’t have their favorites; they certainly do,” added Robert. “Among the favorites and regularly appearing dishes are the Chicken Pineapple Salad and cream based soups. We also have a great selection of vegan and vegetarian dishes that our visitors are telling us they really enjoy.”

Lana and Robert invite locals to come and enjoy dinner on Monday which is “locals’ night.” Chef’s choice entrees are \$10.95 - \$12.95.

The slogan for The Garden Bistro restaurant in Eureka Springs not only describes the delectable food, it aptly de-

scribes owner Lana Campbell’s journey from farmer to chef.

As a child, Lana worked the family’s farm in southern Illinois growing row crops. Her family then operated one of the largest produce farms in southwest Missouri. She was a full-time produce farmer from 1995 to 2008.

“I grew up cooking in the kitchen with the fresh produce that we grew on the farm. It’s a whole different way of cooking.”

After pursuing a career in nursing, coupled with intermittent visits to Eureka Springs, Lana decided with Robert to marry her passion for growing produce with gourmet cooking and open up The Garden Bistro.

“There wasn’t exactly an “ah-ha” moment, but all the pieces just presented themselves and fell in to place one-at-a-time, like the availability of this building for instance,” added Lana.

Robert is not only accomplished in the kitchen, but brings his expertise in construction trades to the restaurant.

According to Robert, “If it can go wrong, it often does and I am lucky enough to be able to fix it most of the time.”

When asked about the challenges and blessing of operating the new restaurant, Lana and Robert agree.

“We’ve been blessed by having an excellent staff. They have been committed to making sure the service matches the great quality of the food. Our biggest challenge is getting the word out about our fresh concept and varied menu. We’d also like to see Eureka Springs go all-out and support the area’s local farmers’ markets.”

Visitors are in for a treat when they visit this “garden-fresh” restaurant that uses locally produced foods to create memorable gourmet dishes.

From the President



YESTERDAY:

I know we stood out among the many communities in the area with our Christmas and holiday celebrations and events.

TODAY:

February 2010 marks the fourth anniversary that I have had the honor and privilege of being the president and CEO of the Greater Eureka Springs Chamber of Commerce. Despite over thirty years of general business, retail and economic development experience, I never cease to learn something new every day. Yet most, if not all, of the time-tested principals of good business are reinforced at every turn.

Several times per month, residents or visitors come to the Chamber with the intention of opening a business or creating an event. I try to steer them in the direction of successful people in Eureka Springs. They always seem willing to help out with making our community a better place to visit, live and work. Show me a struggling operation, and I can likely show you a business that can’t or won’t embrace this critical ingredient.

Another important hallmark of successful businesses is strongly reinforced here. The successful business promotes not only their business but they relish the success of their neighbor, their street, their city, their region and their state. “A rising tide lifts all boats” is as close to an immutable truth as there can be. At the lowest level, lodging needs to recommend places to eat and places to go, restaurants need to be prepared to recommend lodging and things to do and attractions need to be versed in places to dine and stay. Whenever and wherever that web of connections is broken, business will wither. History is strewn with the wreckage of businesses that scorned competition but relied on others for their “word-of-mouth” marketing. Again, show me a struggling business and I’ll show you a business that fails to embrace or even encourage competition that spurs continual improvement and growth. Show me a struggling business and I’ll show you a business that only knows how to throw open their doors each morning, turn their sign to “open” and expects the cash register to ring itself.

One further practice, that I have noted is common to most well regarded businesses, is communication to the community. Open late? Celebrate; tell somebody. Local discounts

on dining? Let people know. Closing for a short hiatus? Announce when you’re open again. Sales and specials? Let lodging hosts in on the news. Successful businesses use their Chamber as an important source of word-of-mouth advertising.

As we move through our quiet season, let’s talk each other up to visitors. Let’s all make sure to invite people to return when Eureka Springs is in full bloom and booming.

I would also like to welcome our new Board of Directors: Jim Nelson, Zeek Taylor, George Purvis and Terry McClung. I look forward to some of the new ideas they can bring to our work plans this year. We bid a fond farewell to Patsy Miller, Debbie Hartsell, Joe Raley and Mike Bishop. I have genuinely valued their counsel during each of their terms and their service benefited our community.

TOMORROW:

I would be remiss I failed to make a pitch for the Governor’s Conference on Tourism coming in March. 700-800 tourism operators from the private sector (and possibly their spouses and/or families) and state tourism associates will be visiting Eureka Springs for the three day conference. This is a great and rare (since 1995, I think) opportunity to show these special visitors why Eureka Springs is The Extraordinary Escape. It’s likely that there will be some shopping and dining going on outside of the conference.
